RM3 Promoting Ramsey Project	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> RMP is pleased to announce that RTC has agreed to part fund the Promoting Ramsey project from April 2018. This along with further funding from RMP (due to an underspend) will allow this to continue for 1 more year. Agreed unanimously by partners present and via email. A new application has been made to HLF with a reduced budget and the result should be known soon. Update – now moved to stage 2.

Project Group Feedback	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RM1a CRUNCH – Going well with new starters. RNT has successfully applied for a grant from the Youth and Crime Commissioner for £2000. to work with young people (aged range 10-20 - or 25 if have additional needs) who may be out of education. The project is to improve their aspirations, provide training and employment support. The RNT Project Manager will run this project. RMP agreed to match this grant as it fits with one of our key aims to improve life chances for young people. • RM1b – BOSH – continuing to be well attended. • RM1c – Toddler Time – Continues to be successful. Dec session had very high numbers attending (49) with Santa and the gifts being popular • RM1e – Skatepark - ongoing • RM2 – Community Transport - A stay has been put on the Huntingdon service withdrawal until August. RMP to write a letter to CCC and speak to DWP re access to Job Centre. • RM4b Grants – There is one application so far. Closing Date 31.01.18. • RM5 – Social Investment - A meeting/training with Job Search volunteers, St Thomas a Becket and the Food Bank has taken place.
Plan Review Theme 1 – Young People	<p>Young People</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bosh and Crunch are providing more opportunities for young people • Young people can experience trips and activities that they would not otherwise have been able to • These activities are increasing their confidence and skills • The recruiting of young people initially as volunteers and then with further training as paid staff has been a great success providing skills, experience and something for club attendees to aspire to • Advice and support is available in an unstructured environment at the clubs - but is limited • Young people are still lacking a hub i.e. indoor space • Young people are supporting other events as volunteers • BL's Tweet 20/20 done at CRUNCH, to enable their views to be heard. • Intergenerational understanding is being promoted for example helping organise Red House Christmas party • Some young people from 'disadvantaged' or 'difficult' backgrounds attend CRUNCH so we are achieving our aim of supporting this group • Our clubs are meeting the needs of young people that do not attend other recognised/uniformed clubs/activities
